GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ACCEPTANCE FALL 2017

The Guaranteed Professional Program Admissions Initiative requires students of all programs to adhere to the following rules and regulations:

- 1. All courses for the undergraduate degree must be taken at the University of Illinois at Chicago except study abroad experiences and special programs. Those students pursuing study abroad experiences and special programs must inform the GPPA Undergraduate Coordinator.
- 2. Each student must maintain full-time student status (at least 12 credit hours) and complete 12 credit hours for the Fall and Spring semesters.
- 3. All courses taken and all grades earned at UIC will be calculated into the GPA used for determining standing within the GPPA program. No GPA recalculation, grade exclusion or similar policies may be utilized.
- 4. Each student must adhere to the UIC student Code of Conduct. Any infraction of an unprofessional nature including disciplinary and criminal infractions could be cause for dismissal from the GPPA program and removal of the guarantee.
- 5. Each student must matriculate to his or her graduate or professional program within five years of the Fall 2017 semester unless otherwise stated.
- 6. Each student must adhere to any specific program requirements listed in the program- based Conditions of Acceptance for students entering Fall 2017.
