Conditions of Acceptance-Fall 2016

Undergraduate Curriculum

Any undergraduate major is acceptable. Students are required to take the following:

English 160 and 161 English Composition I and II (or the equivalent)

Two additional upper-level (200, 300, or 400 level) courses that have a substantial expository writing component

One course with a substantial oral communication component

Students must seek approval for writing and communication courses from the GPPA coordinator.

Additional Requirements

Students must enroll in the Honors College and fulfill all requirements for continued membership each term

Students must maintain full-time student status of at least 12 credit hours each term

Students must maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.4 (A=4.00) throughout their undergraduate years

Students must complete the LSAT by February of the year prior to matriculation into Chicago-Kent College of Law and achieve a score of at least 158 (the range of possible LSAT scores is 120 to 180)

Students must complete Honors College Capstone requirement with a faculty member from Chicago-Kent College of Law or UIC mentor

In the final year of undergraduate work, complete an application to Chicago-Kent College of Law to reserve a seat upon graduation from UIC

Students must complete a baccalaureate degree prior to entry into Chicago-Kent College of Law

Students may not enroll in Chicago-Kent College of Law for a period of three years from the time that they matriculate into their undergraduate college at UIC. They must also complete all baccalaureate course work at UIC within five years from the beginning of the freshman year.

Students must adhere to the General Conditions of Acceptance for students of all GPPA programs entering in the year that they are admitted to the program.
